
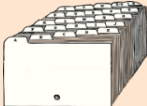



Revisiting Paperless Admission at UCLA iSchool

Admission Records Workflow:	Applications are submitted online. Transcripts and diplomas are mailed.	Online application files are dragged to FileMaker Pro and put in CCLE.	All paper records are scanned and added to CCLE	GPA is manually calculated. Diploma authenticity is checked.	A copy of all applications (140+) is printed for review.	Admission letters are mailed. Other records are kept until the retention period has lapsed.
